

What if you have already graduated before?

Children can graduate more than once if they wish to. However, just as in real life, each time you graduate your qualification is a little more special and more challenging to achieve. This means that anyone graduating for the second time will need to collect more stamps than they did for their first graduation. For a fourth or more graduation four differently coloured books must be filled.

How many points do you need to graduate?

To graduate at Ormesby University you will need to collect the following number of signatures by **Friday 11th June 2027**:

Honours Degree (1st graduation)	-	60 stamps (1 full passport - white)
Masters Degree (2nd graduation)	-	120 stamps (2 full passports - white & yellow)
Doctorate (3rd graduation)	-	180 stamps (3 full passports - white, yellow & blue)
Double Doctorate (4th+ graduation)	-	240 stamps (4 full passports - white, yellow, blue & green)

Only full booklets will be accepted. Booklets not signed, dated or back-dated will not be accepted, as we wish to ensure the achievement of this award remains special.

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What is Ormesby University?

Ormesby University is a scheme to encourage children to take part in a wider range of enrichment activities. Children will be able to collect signatures for attending enrichment and extra-curricular activities both in



and out of school. These signatures can then be saved up and the children will then be able to take part in a graduation ceremony, complete with cap and gown. This is the third year that Ormesby University has taken place and we hope to see a good number of pupils graduating this year.

Why should you take part?

We believe that every child should be given the opportunity to shine whilst they are at our school. Taking part in a wide variety of activities will give children the opportunity to discover new interests and hidden talents. It will also give them new life skills and enable them to form new friendships. It will teach them about resilience, about displaying a growth mindset and give them a real sense of independence.

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How can you earn points? (Start now over Summer 2026)

Children can earn university points in a variety of ways:

- Attending lunchtime or after school clubs provided by the school.
- Taking part in our half-termly enrichment days.
- Attending clubs outside of school (if the club is willing to participate)
- Visiting museums, libraries or other educational sites.

Each session that is attended will earn a child one signature point. Once enough signature points have been collected and the books are completely filled, pupils will be able to graduate.

How will you keep track of your signature points?

Each child will be given an Ormesby University Passport that they can use to keep all of their signatures in one place. They will need to take the passport with them to all clubs that they attend and **ask the leader politely to initial and date** the next available box. It is very important that they keep their passport in a safe place. Please note that it is your child's responsibility to remember their passport at each club and ask for it to be signed and dated. Once a passport is filled, your child must inform the Office in order to get the next coloured passport (unless it is their first graduation). **All passports must be kept by your child as an evidence record until the set deadline.**

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
